

Rain Catcher Pilot Program (RCPP)

The RCPP is a collaboration of city departments, non-profits and other partners, which offers technical assistance and financial incentives to eligible property owners to install rain gardens, rainwater irrigated trees, and/or cisterns that capture and slow down stormwater.

Pilot Timeframe: October 2018 - January 2024
of Properties: Approximately 1400
Location: Upper portion of Waller
Creek Watershed (47% impervious
cover, heavily residential, 1.08 sq. mile)



Why did Watershed Protection (WPD) create this program?

- 2011 WPD created a Green Stormwater Infrastructure Team
- 2012 City adopted, "Imagine Austin" comprehensive plan with green infrastructure as a priority area
- 2017 completed national benchmarking of residential green stormwater infrastructure incentive programs & local survey
- 2017 2018
 - Relationship building
 - Approval
 - Funding





Watershed Protection

City of Austin

- Provides
 - Pilot program administration
 - Ambassadors
 - Funding for non-profit partner
 - \$1 per gallon
 - Drainage Charge Discount
 - Associated scientific and sociological studies

• Focus

- Include community members in the solution
- Strengthen "one water" concept and collaborations
- Improve urban hydrology (Increase base flow in creeks, reduce erosive events)
- Increase enrollment in the Drainage Charge Discount



Austin Water

City of Austin

- Provides
 - Expertise –doing rainwater focused incentives since the 1990s
 - Administers existing rebate programs
 - Funding for existing rebate programs including:
 - Rainwater Harvesting up to \$5,000 for equipment to capture rainwater
 - WaterWise Landscape up to \$1,750 to convert turf grass to native plant beds
 - WaterWise Rainscape up to \$500 for landscape features that hold rainwater
 - Mulch and Hose Timer rebates

• Focus

Conservation – Reduce use of potable water for CATCHER PILOT PROGRAM

Urban Forestry

City of Austin

- Provides
 - \$1,000 towards a combination of front yard cistern that passively waters a street tree + \$350 for additional rainwater irrigated trees
- Focus

- Increase the number of street trees
- This geographic area is within their target area to increase urban canopy cover



Urban Patchwork

501(c)(3) non-profit

- Provides
 - Streamlining of the process
 - Free rainwater focused site assessment
 - Connects participant with a contractor
 - Inspects installed systems
 - Completes rebate applications
 - Gathers data and submits reports to the City
 - Contractor training
- Focus
 - Ecologically restorative landscaping
 - Private residential property and public space

 Turning a patchwork of underutilized **CATCHER** spaces into a quilt of common good














- Reduced drainage charge


